

Town of Mason Council
Special Meeting
July 23, 2024, 3:30 p.m., Town Hall

A special meeting of the Mason Town Council was opened by Mayor Kristopher Clark with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

Present were Clark, Recorder Mindy Kearns, and council members Mike Zirkle, Sarah Stover, Steve Ohlinger and Becky Pearson. Absent was Jill Nelson.

Minutes from the regular meeting on July 11, 2024 were approved upon motion by Ohlinger and second by Zirkle. The motion passed. There were no bills.

Clark said he has been working on splash pad plans, and the building on Dogwood Street has been razed.

Unfinished Business:

The second reading of the Junk/Refuse/Weeds Ordinance amendment was read and accepted following a motion by Ohlinger and second by Stover.

The second reading of the Dilapidate Properties Ordinance amendment was read and accepted following a motion by Zirkle and second by Pearson.

The second reading of the Zoning Ordinance amendment was read and accepted following a motion by Pearson and second by Ohlinger.

New Business:

Steve Ohlinger was hired as the office cleaner at town hall at a rate of \$10 per hour for up to 10 hours a week. The motion was made by Zirkle, seconded by Stover and passed. Ohlinger abstained from the vote.

Upon motion by Ohlinger and second by Pearson, the council members voted to proceed with plans to pave Fourth Street from Anderson to Ruttencutter Lane, including the "T" at Ruttencutter and several potholes.

The council members agreed to allow the town workers to take up a section of sidewalk on Second Street in front of Dr. Henry's office to see how it can be replaced.

Clark said the meeting regarding the boat launch was cancelled and there was no update.

The next meeting was set for Aug. 15 at 6:30 p.m., due to the Mason County Fair being on the regular meeting date.

Ohlinger made the motion to adjourn.
